# Municipal Court's Early Bail Review

- PHILADELPHIA
- Launched in July 2016 to reduce the number of people in custody on low bail amounts.
- Serve as a transitional measure until cash bail is eliminated.
- Collaboration Partners: Municipal Court, Pretrial Services, Defender Association, and District Attorney's Office.
- More time for counsel to interview clients and present information in support of release.
- Reinforcement of pretrial requirements by the judge, pretrial, and defender.

#### **Pretrial Cash Bail No Detainers Population**

This includes individuals who are confined pretrial with no detainers on charges with active or revoked bail.





- With the implementation of the pretrial risk tool, transform EBR hearings to detention review hearings for those suggested for pretrial detention
