# How Cities Contribute Toward Reducing Jail Numbers

Cities rarely in the lead on efforts to reduce the use of jails despite having opportunities to contribute.

## **Opportunity:**

Strong starting points for cities to contribute to jail use reduction goals include

- public-facing support from elected city leaders,
- police departments or municipal courts implementing diversion, and
- collaboration with counties.

## Emerging Examples of City Led Early Diversion from Jail

Who diverts	Eligible offenses	Diversion to what
<b>Police, Sheriff or City</b> <b>Attorney</b> (prosecutor for Municipal Court)	Disturbing the peace-type offenses	Community-led restorative justice
Police	Misdemeanors	County and other community services
Police	<b>Disorderly conduct</b> (non-domestic violence)	Restorative court and other services
Police	Property/quality of life charges	Case management, services, no charge
State Court through Police	Felonies at discretion of court	Court summons without pretrial detention
