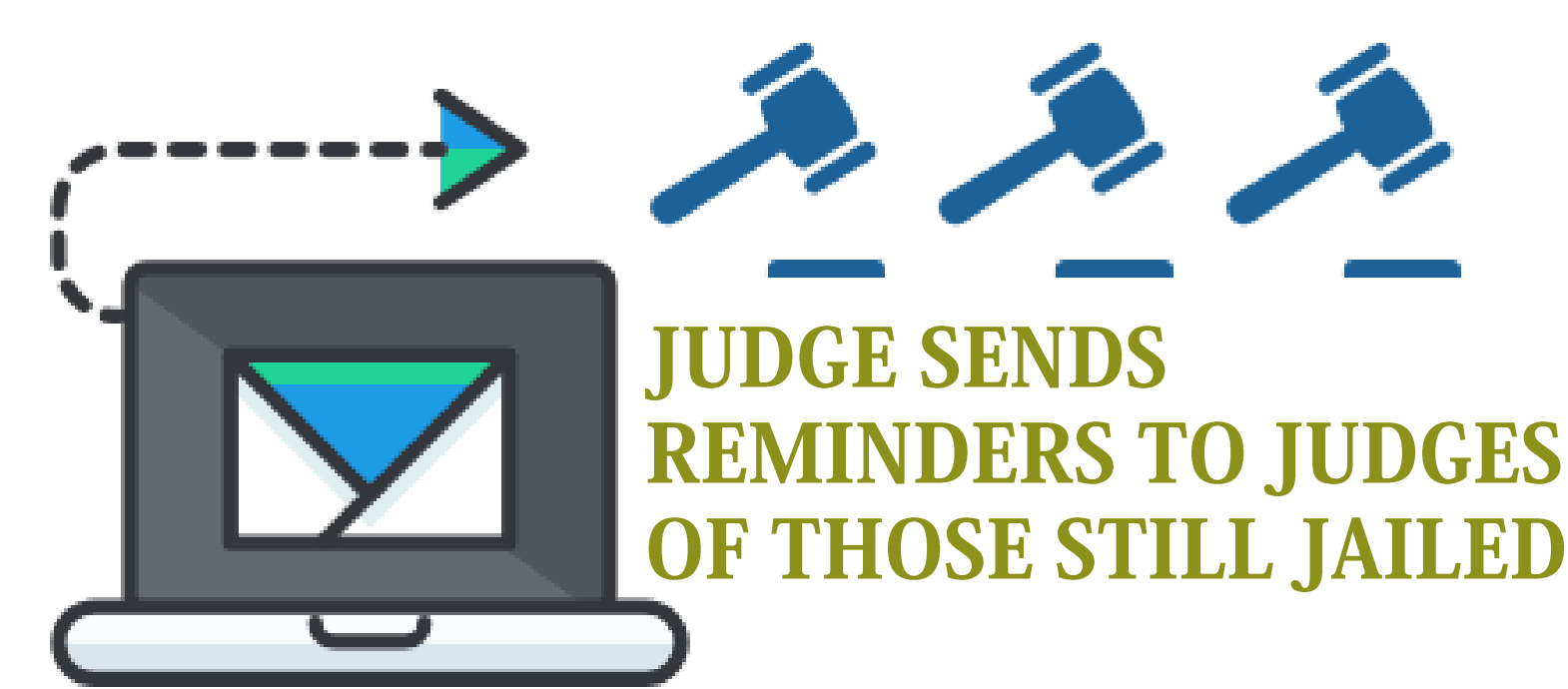


Using Data and Strategy Innovations to Reduce The Jail Population in St. Louis County, Missouri

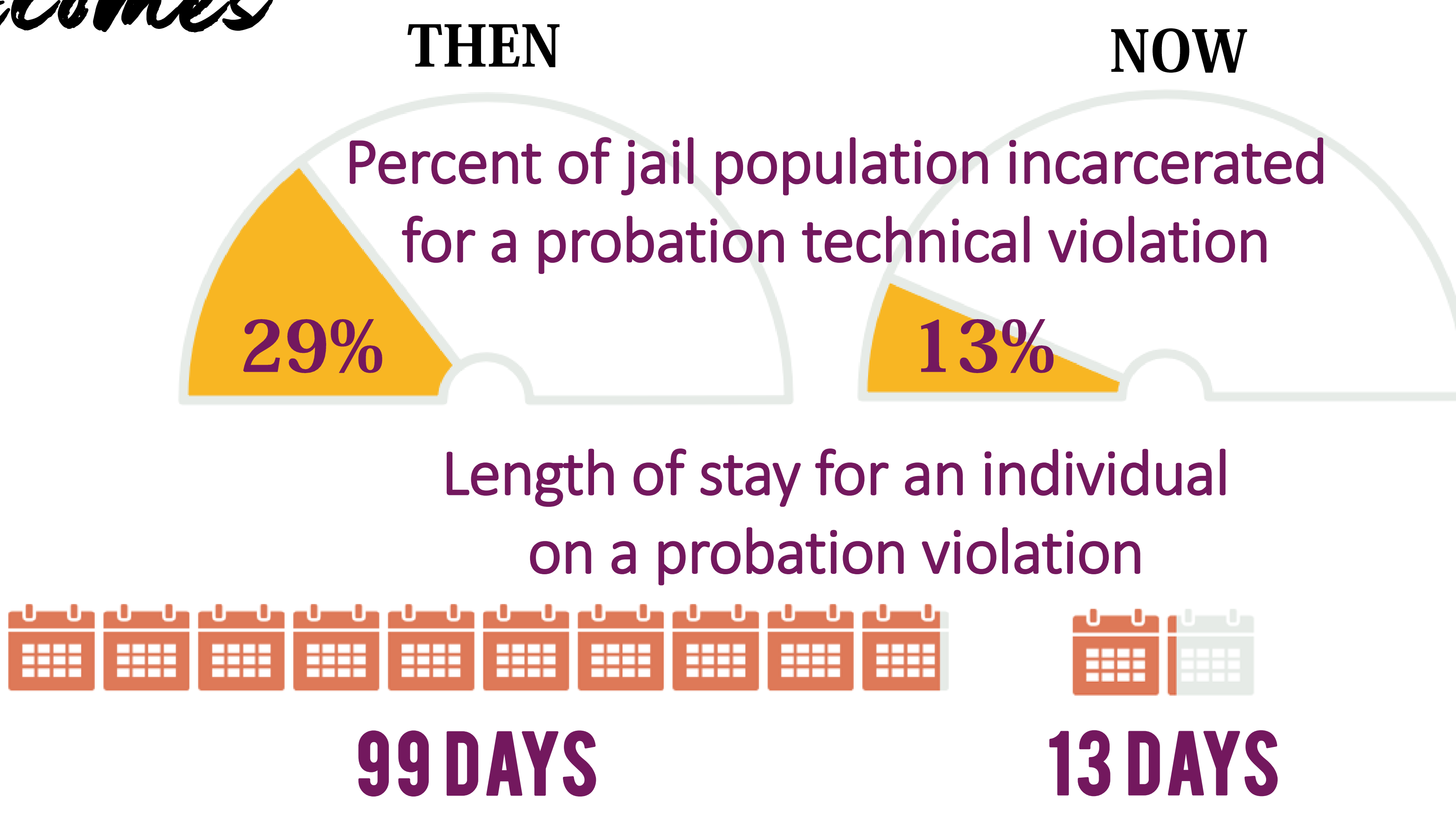
Problem

Innovation

- Probation Violation
Incarceration Length of Stay
- Screen all individuals returned for a probation violation
 - Fast track the probation violation hearing phase to less than 10 days
 - Provide comprehensive treatment services
 - Work with judges to facilitate a hearing or release
 - Review all incarcerated individuals for probation violations with DOC every week



Outcomes

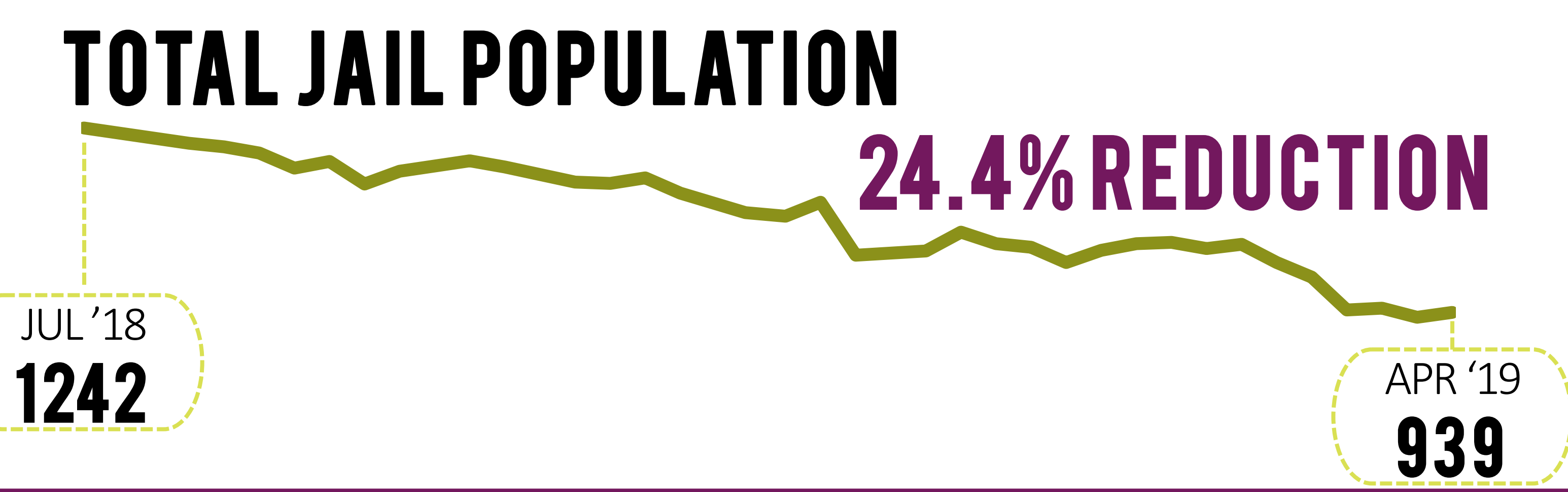
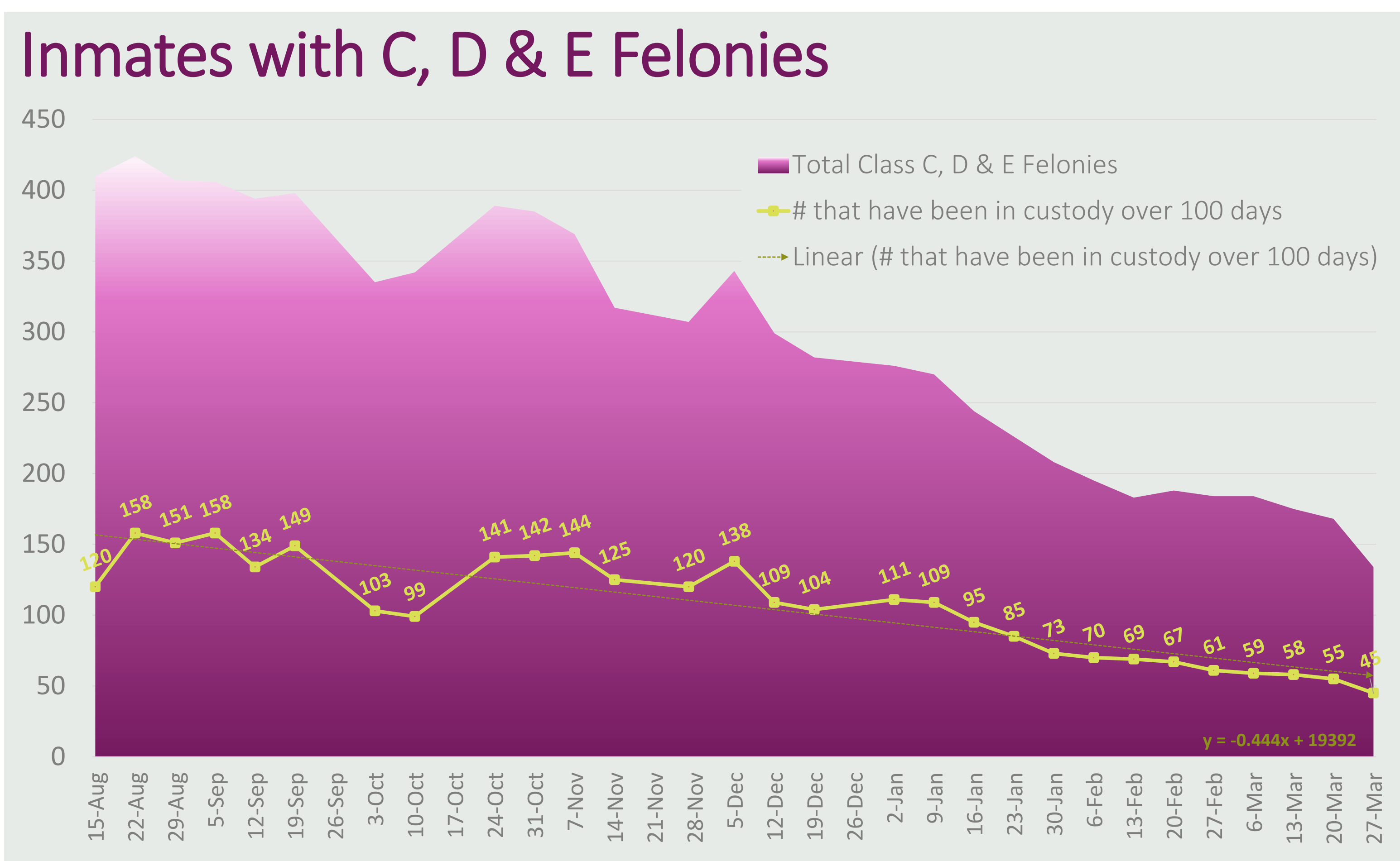
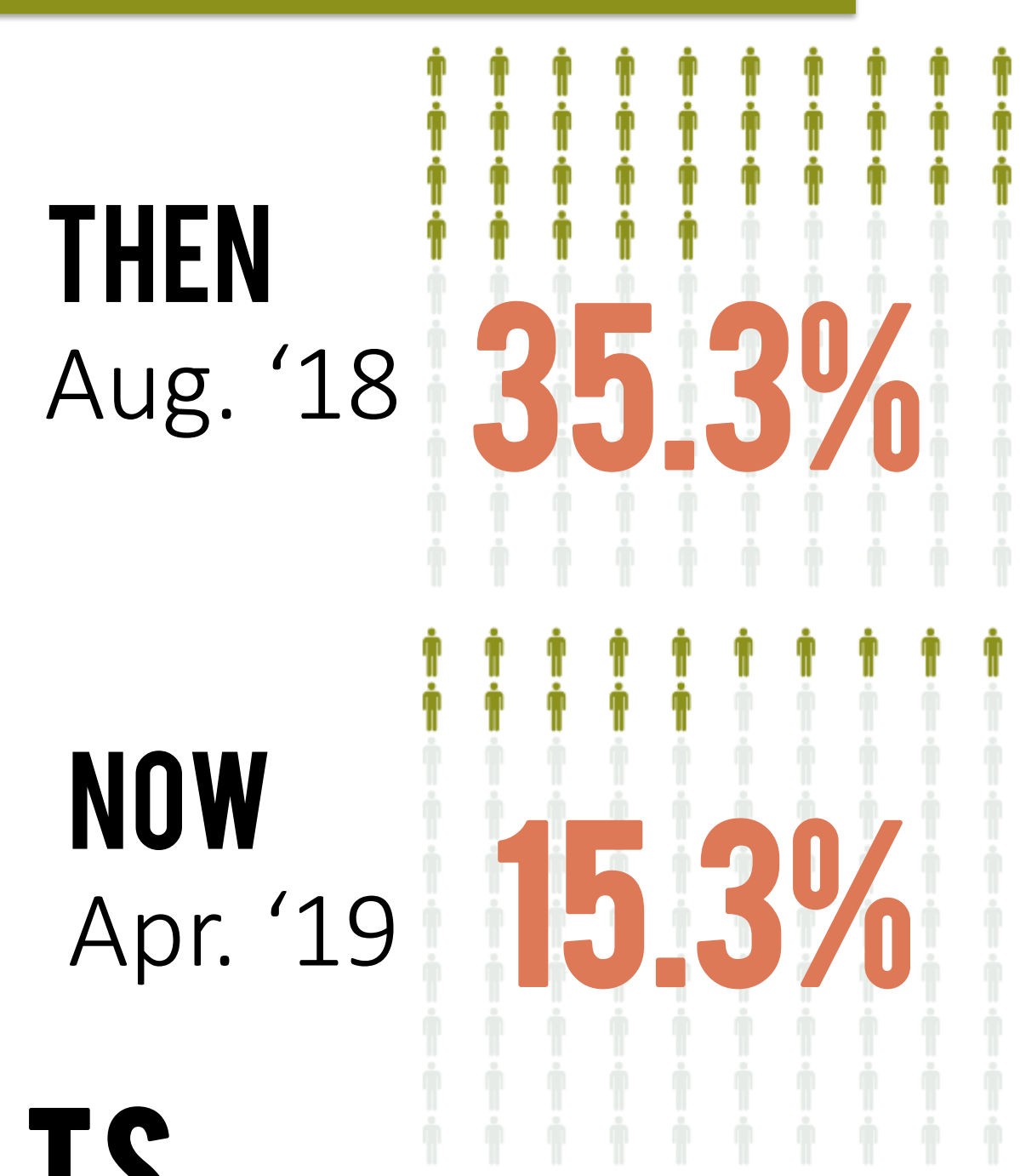


Nonviolent – Class C, D & E – Felonies (and those incarcerated over 100 days)

The Population Review Team (established August 2018) identifies best practices for effective, safe, and just case processing while maintaining community safety. The team meets weekly to review cases of inmates charged with nonviolent offenses and answers the following:

1. What are the barriers to release?
2. Are there alternatives to incarceration?
3. Justification for alternatives
4. Recommendations and next steps

TEAM RESULTS

As of 3/28/19, 154 of 187 people reviewed have been released during the project period (82.3%)



LOOKING AHEAD

- Collaboration is key. The multiple agencies represented in the Population Review Team (PRT) will continue communicating and working together.
- PRT will begin examining racial and ethnic disparities more deliberately and deep dive into court processing delays.
- St. Louis County is currently working to implement the PSA by Fall 2019.
