




Over 3,000 counties - nearly every one has a jail




2,000 of these jails are in rural counties; 700+ are in small / mid-sized metropolitan counties




High pretrial incarceration rates: historically an urban phenomenon



Now pretrial incarceration is most prevalent in smaller counties



The urban-rural divide worsens: Changes in jail incarceration rates, 2013-2018



Rural jail incarceration rates now well over double urban jail incarceration rates


Data collected from 1,864 counties in June – July 2018.

2013-2018 change in jail incarceration rates per 100,000 working age residents.

US Jail Population (1980)







US Jail Population (2015)










Women in small county jails now make up nearly one half of all women in jail




Between 1970 and 2014, the number of women in jails increased from under 8,000 to nearly 110,000. In small counties, the number increased from approximately 1,700 to 51,600.






The jail incarceration rate for white people has grown the most in small/rural counties



The jail incarceration rate for black people -- generally the highest -- has not abated in rural counties




Despite recent trends, the jail incarceration rate for black people is 3.6x greater than for white people

Incarceration rates in my community are too high.


I would be concerned if incarceration rates in my community were higher than in others.






Thinking about Characteristics and Assets of Rural Counties...

- Closer, intertwined personal, social, professional, and system-based relationships – a different kind of discretion?
- Smaller numbers and budgets → different metrics
- Less frequent/consistent presence of CJ institutions (e.g. court hearings) & social services
- Fewer people with many hats & many demands
 - Also more collaboration across sectors and counties
 - More presence of faith and inter-faith groups in social issues
- Relationships with neighboring Native American governments and communities – on and off reservations
