Definition of Community Engagement

A process that includes multiple techniques to promote the participation of residents in community life, especially those who are excluded and isolated.





Why CE is Important

- Only by engaging diverse voices will we solve our most difficult problems.
- The people most affected by the problems have to have a say in solving the problem or the solutions will not fit the problem.
- Because of the disenfranchisement/oppression of certain groups, community engagement gives these groups a process for healing and strengthening the connections they need to thrive.



Differences in Participation



- Service: The performance of any duties or work *for* another; helpful or professional activity
- Outreach: Informing, recruiting, or collecting feedback for ideas and/or projects that are already conceived of by an organization
- Engagement: Community members are leaders and producers, not for one specific issue, but in a sustained process for many issues and opportunities as they come up
