Public Defender clients were not showing up for court as a result of multiple barriers.

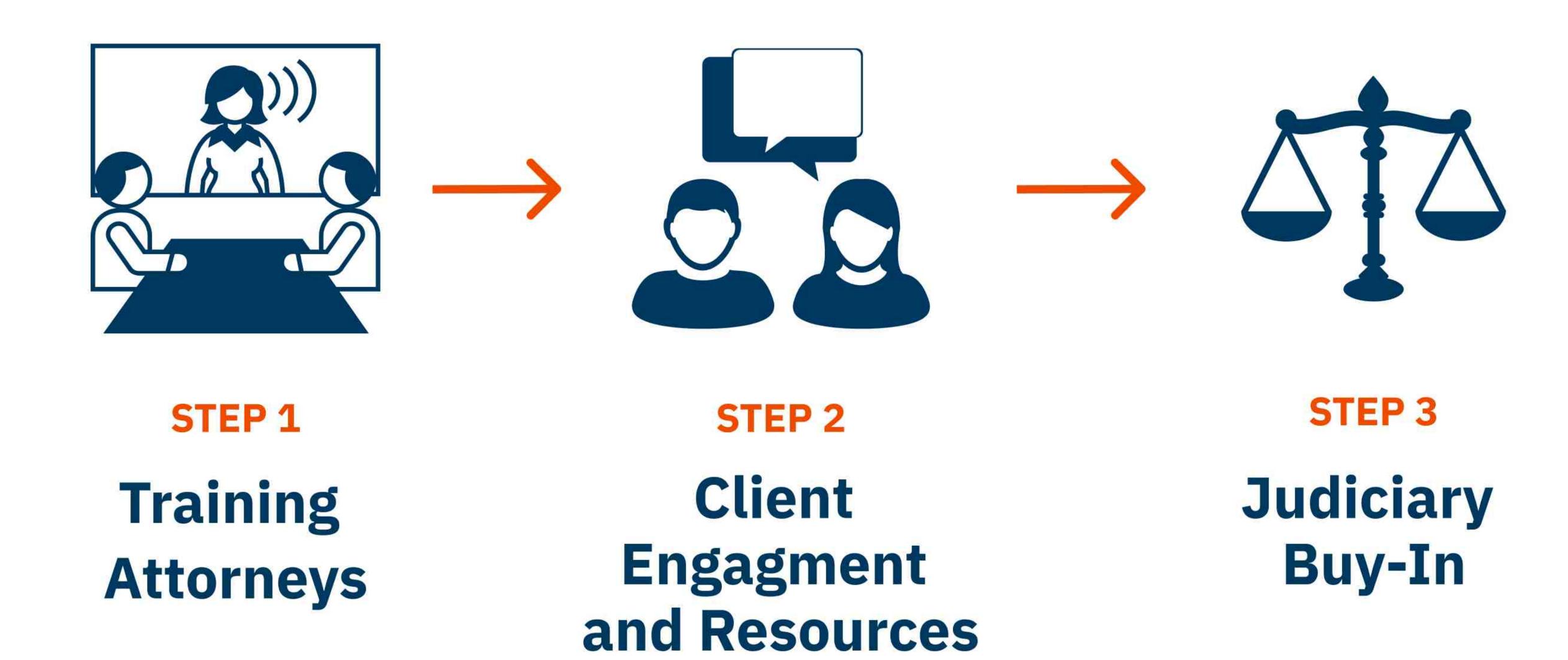
WHY IT MATTERS

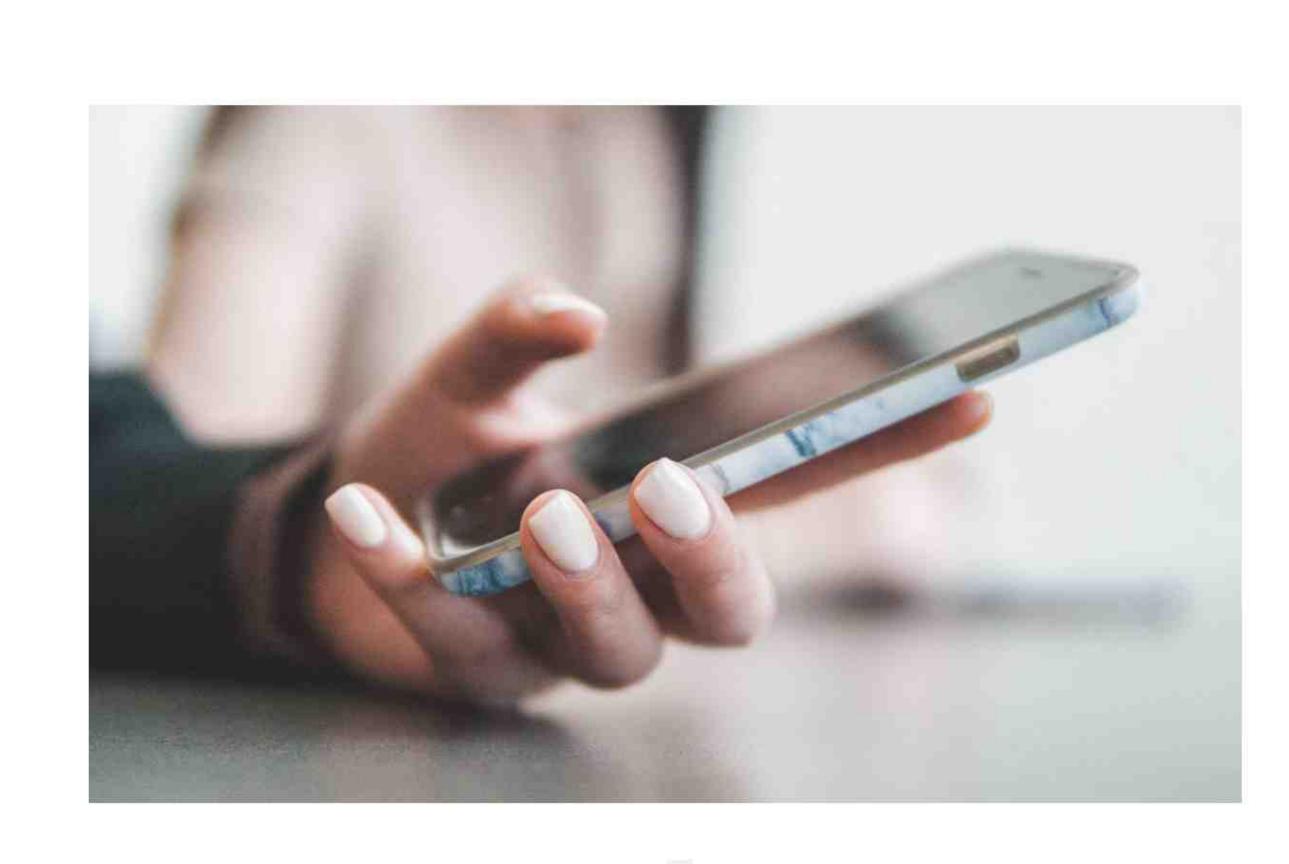
Unaddressed social service needs like transportation, childcare, and employment support lead to ongoing criminal justice system entanglement. Getting people to court and avoiding failure to appear warrants is critical. It is also important to make sure defendants get the help needed to improve their chances of avoiding continued criminal justice entanglement.

INNOVATION

Implementation of a two-way messaging system. Placement of a social worker in the Public Defender's office and court house.
