- Measure 1. Cook County Jail Population Trends – monthly avg + snapshot
- Measure 2. Initial Bond Orders set for felony defendants with a Public Safety Assessment
- Measure 3. Deposit bond amount needed to secure initial release from custody
- Measure 3. Dollar amount needed to post for deposit bonds
- Measure 4. Rate of pretrial release by initial bond order
- Measure 5. Court Appearance Rate – defendants on pretrial release at all hearings
- Measure 6. Community Safety Rate – defendants on pretrial release no new charges filed
- Measure 7. Risk for New Violent Criminal Activity – elevated risk + new charges

This dashboard presents seven key performance measures being used to monitor implementation of the Model Bond Court initiative in the Circuit Court of Cook County.

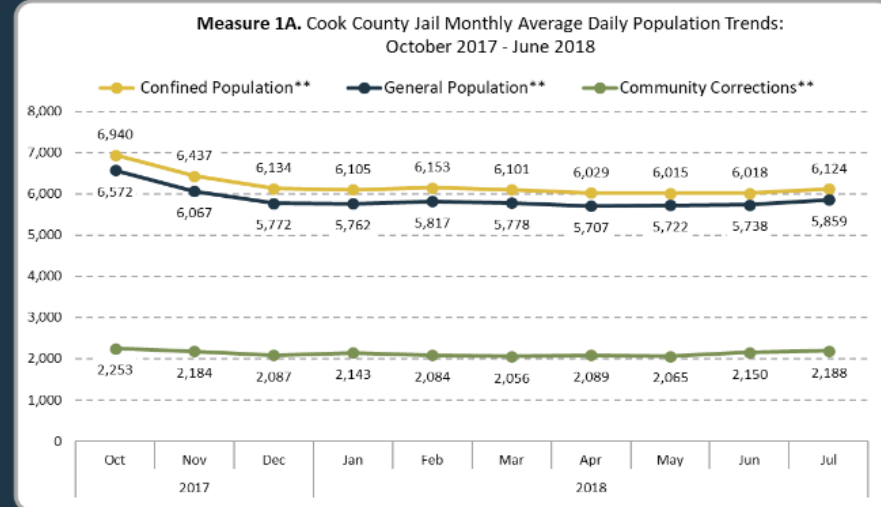
MEASURE 1. COOK COUNTY JAIL POPULATION TRENDS

Measure 1A shows the Cook County Jail's monthly average daily population trends post-implementation of General Order 18.8A (Effective September 18, 2017).

- **General Population** - From October 2017 to June 2018, the General Population decreased 12.7%.
- **Confined Population** - From October 2017 to June 2018, the Confined Population also decreased 13.3%.
- **Community Corrections Population (Sheriff's Electronic Monitoring)** - From October 2017 to June 2018, the Community Corrections Population decreased 4.6%.

Reduction in Jail Population Pre-Implementation of General Order 18.8A

- From July 2015 (implementation of the Public Safety Assessment in Central Bond Court) to October 2017 (first full month post-implementation of G.O. 18.8A) the monthly ADP of the general population decreased by 16% (from 7,822 to 6,572).



^A Average Daily Population "ADP" calculations generated by the Office of the Chief Judge (OCJ) Information Services Department using "Sheriff's Daily Report" (October 2017 - June 2018). The daily reports are provided to the OCJ by the Cook County Sheriff's Office Bureau of Information and Technology Business Intelligence Unit. The Sheriff's Daily Report does not provide subcategory breakdown of the inmate population (e.g., pre-trial detainees, sentenced individuals, charged with felony or misdemeanor, etc.). The monthly ADP calculation totals the number of inmates on each day of the month being measured divided by the number of days in the month.

DASHBOARD TYPOLOGIES

Dashboard Definition

A **data dashboard** is an information management tool that visually tracks, analyzes and displays key performance indicators, metrics and data points to monitor and analyze the health of an organization and its performance.

- **Statistical** – counting stuff, data
- **Performance** – measuring outcomes
- **Decision-making** – merging data and performance

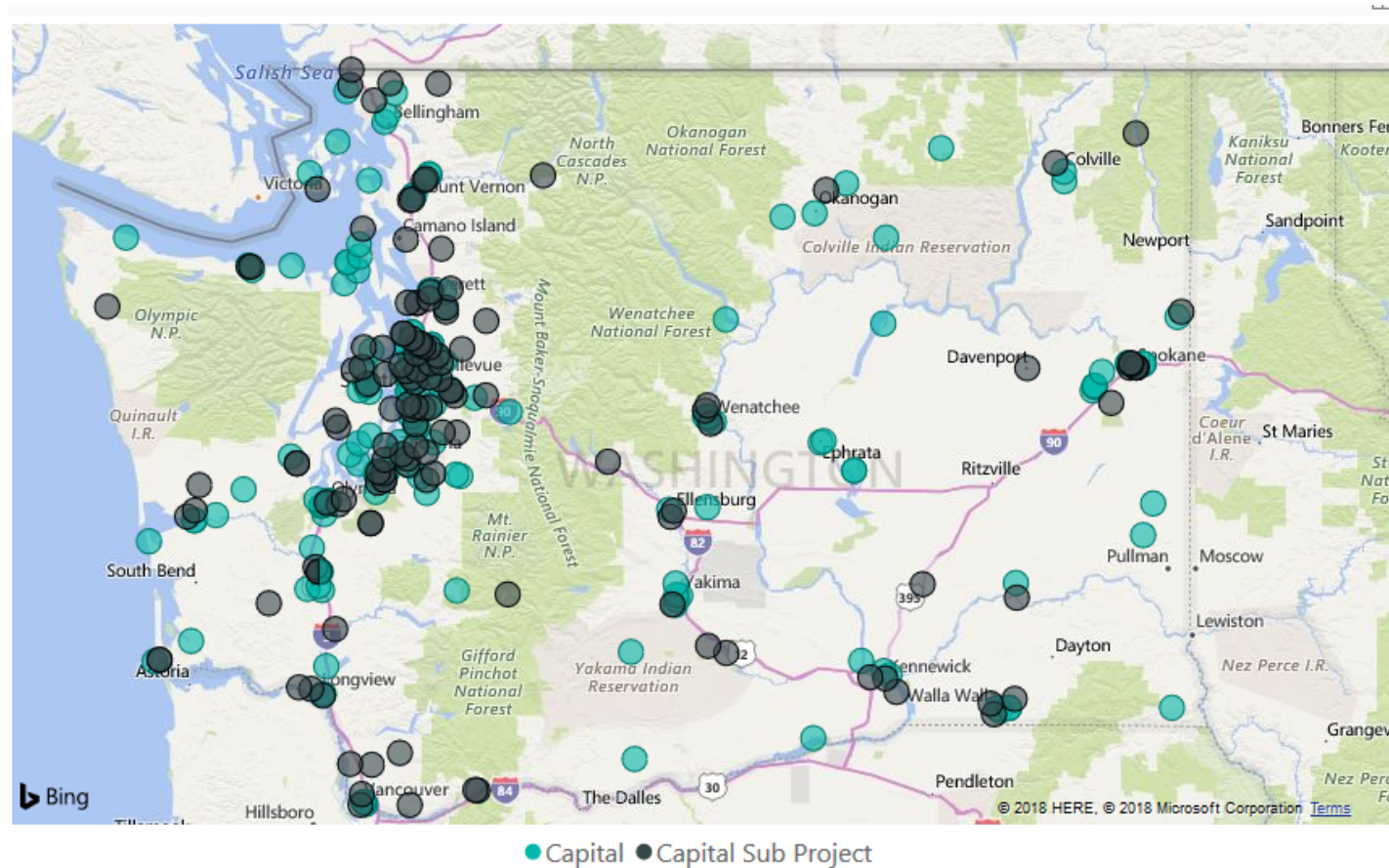

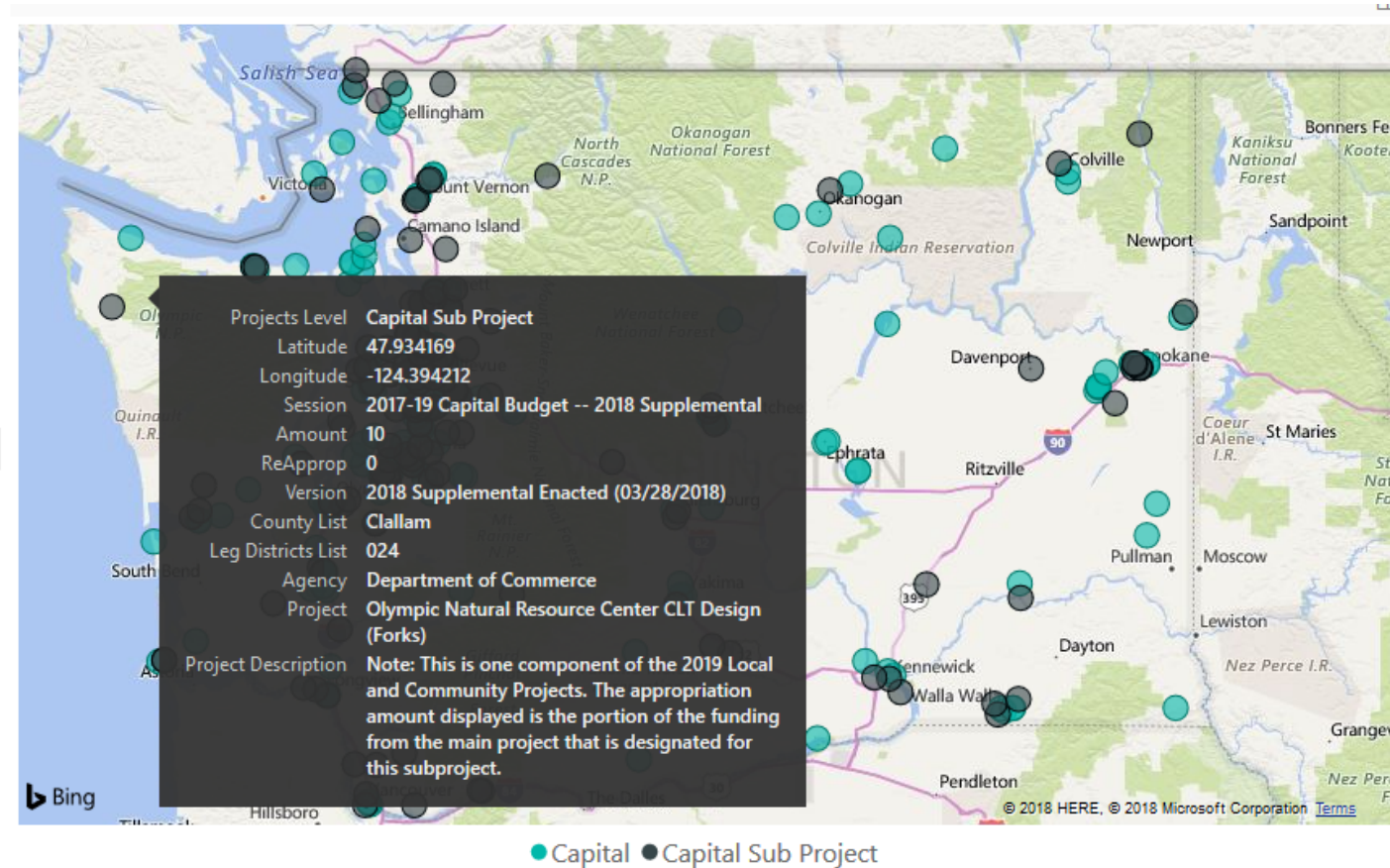

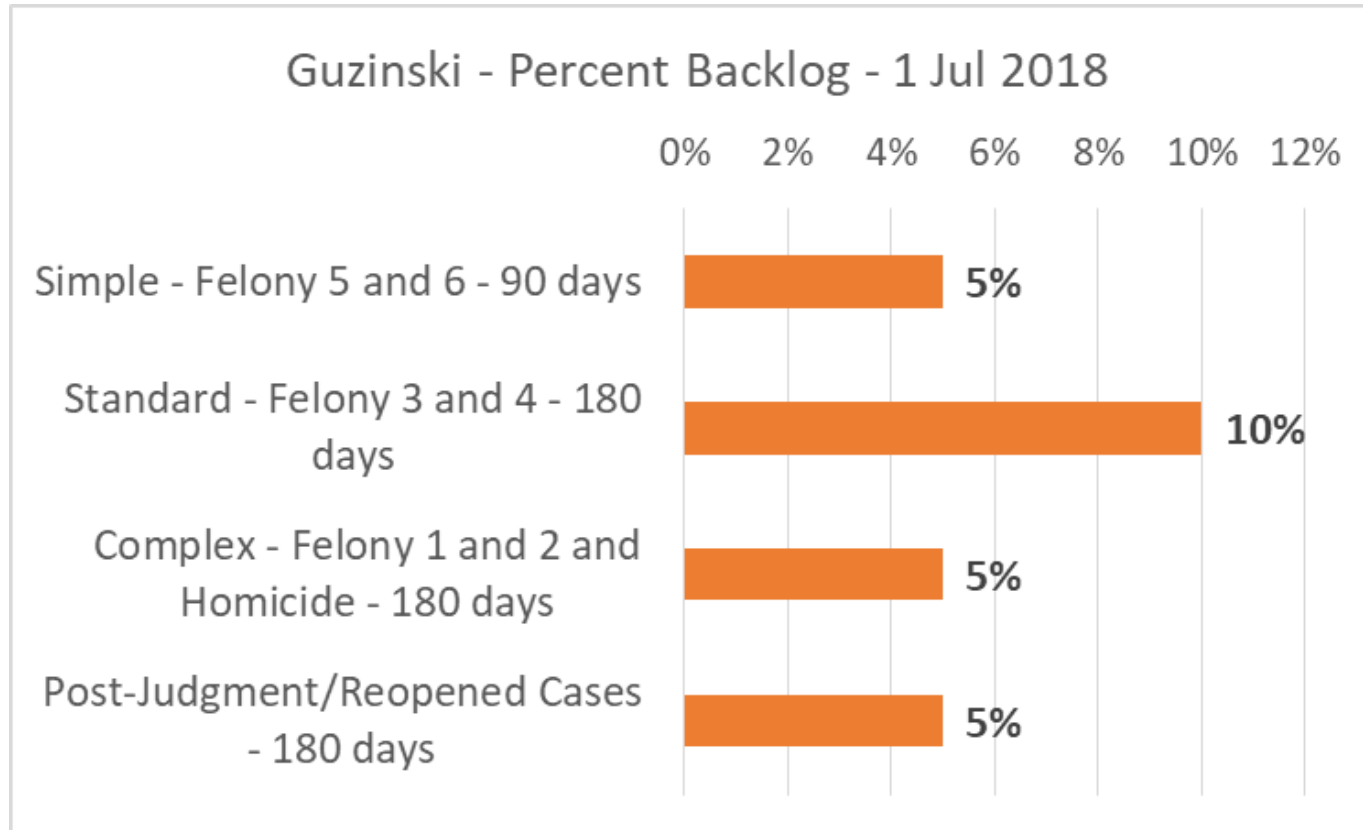

Cook County, Bond Court Dashboard



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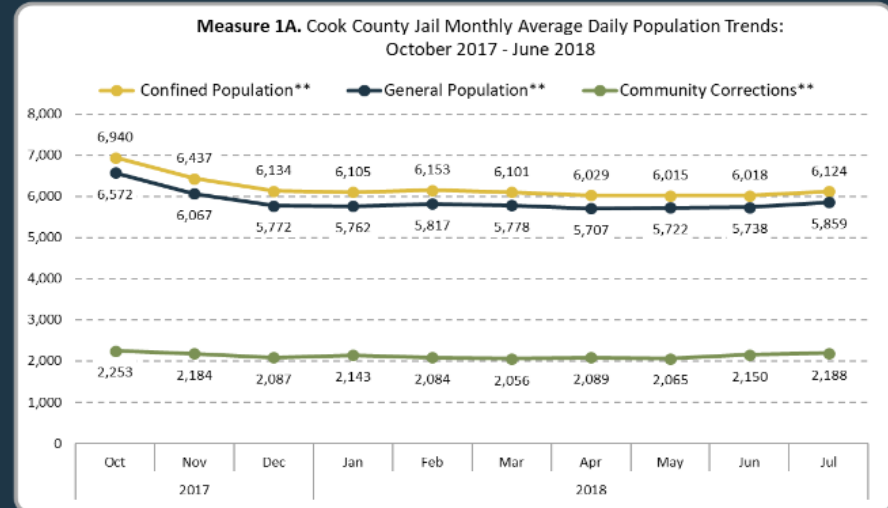

GENERAL ORDER NO. 18.8A

Procedures for Bail Hearings and Pretrial Release

This order is intended to ensure no defendant is held in custody prior to trial solely because the defendant cannot afford to post bail, to ensure fairness and the elimination of unjustifiable delay in the administration of justice, to facilitate the just determination of every criminal proceeding, and to preserve the public welfare and secure the fundamental human rights of individuals with interests in criminal court cases.

2. Build capacity – terminology 7th Circuit

Track	Case-types or highest charge types	Expected case duration and notes
Felony Track 1	Felony class 5 Felony class 6	These are mostly presumptive probation cases. These cases should be assigned a trial date which is 120 days following the defendant's first appearance in Circuit Court. Cases on this track have a dispositional goal of 60 days following the defendant's first appearance.
Felony Track 2	Felony class 3 Felony class 4	These cases should be assigned a trial date which is 150 days following the defendant's first appearance in Circuit Court. Cases on this track have a dispositional goal of 100 days following the defendant's first appearance.
Felony Track 3	Homicide Felony class 1 Felony class 2 Complex felony cases	Other felony class cases may be reassigned to Track 3. Before or at the first appearance in Circuit Court, cases will be assigned a trial date no more than 180 days in the future. Cases on this track have a dispositional goal of 125 days following the defendant's first appearance.

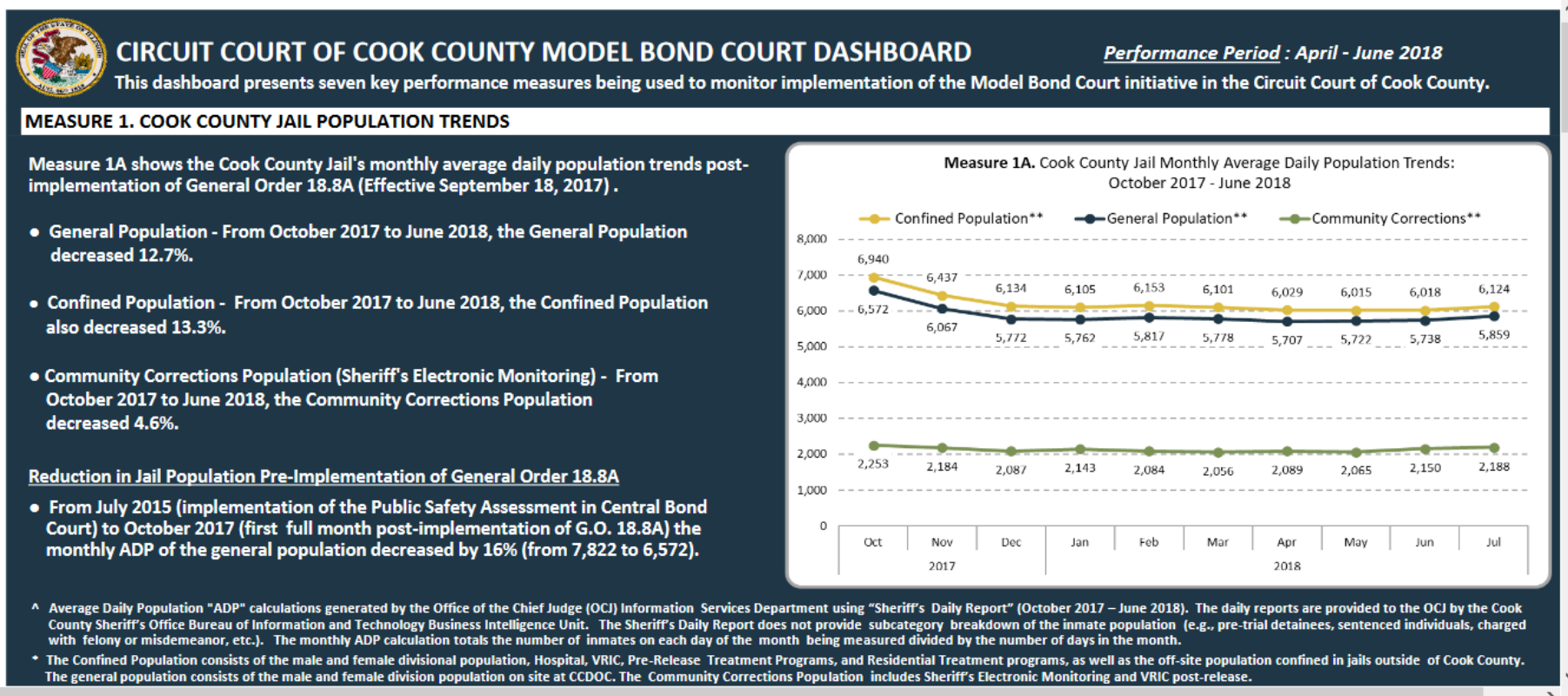
