




Re-hospitalization Rates By Length of Previous Hospitalization






Arrest Rates of Individuals with Serious Mental Illness receiving Assertive Community Treatment Services




Involuntary Inpatient Commitments Point-in-Time Averages By Fiscal Year





- No shootings in target area
- Progress made on CeaseFire Chicago (CURE Violence) staff salary reimbursement rate – outstanding \$8K discrepancy resolved
- 2 new participants and 19 referrals reported, detailed report of all referrals due Feb. 1
- Hiring Panel for 1 VI, 1 OW approved and being coordinated, 11 applicants, 5 recommended for interviews
- CeaseFire Chicago planning site visits to NOLA to provide support after review of shooting and murder #s, and to connect with City Leadership (late January, early




